• Rat River Health Council 2008 <u>www.ratriverhealth.ca</u> This non-profit organization was created in 1994 in preparation for the dissolution of hospital boards to make

room for Regional Health Authorities. It was created by and for the communities of the RM of De Salaberry and the Village of St-Pierre-Jolys. It represents the needs of the people served by the De Salaberry District Health Centre. It sees many opportunities as Manitoba undertakes the transformation of the delivery of health care services. Its Board Members are from the following organizations: Village of St-Pierre-Jolys; RM of De Salaberry; Chambers of Commerce of St-Pierre-Jolys and St. Malo; De Salaberry District Health Centre Foundation; St. Pierre Manor; Chalet Malouin; 2 people at large; 1 physician. The local pharmacies are advisory members, as well as the Director of the De Salaberry District Health Centre and his/her manager. \*

- Crow Wing Trail Association <u>www.crowwingtrail.ca</u> A non-profit organization created in 1999 to develop, maintain and promote the section of the Trans Canada Trail between Winnipeg and Emerson. The route was kept as close as possible to the original Red River Ox Cart trail used in the mid-1800s. It uses municipal low traffic roads, parks, community trails, and bush trails between pastures. It attracts people from near and far (internationally as well). It is the route used by the Actif Epica race on the long weekend in February and is in the process of developing passports, one of which will encourage travellers to and from Spain. Its Board Members are comprised of some municipal councillors and residents at large in the RM's of Ritchot, De Salaberry, Emerson-Franklin, Town of Niverville and Village of St-Pierre-Jolys.\*
- Paroisse St-Pierre <u>www.paroissesaintpierre.org</u> The Parish is undergoing renewal as many other parishes and religions are, in order to best meet the needs of its parishioners/ community members. This new web site is in development and is meant to provide a means of reaching out.\*
