- 1. Reframe the problem: Find common ground and work together against problem.
- 2. Don't try to win the conversation: Avoid an argument and solve problem together.
- 3. Help the other party feel safe: Have positive intentions with a respectful approach.
- 4. Remember to be curious: Learn the other person's perspective.
- 5. Choose the right time to have the conversation: Give advance notice to prepare.
