Wow, what a beautifully warm October! I hope you took the time to enjoy the outdoors.

Let's start by talking about what's on everyone's mind, construction! When is it going to end!!! Why are we ripping up the Main Street when it was just repayed recently.

Well, the open cutting construction should be done very soon. We were expecting it to be completed by the end of October but, with all construction projects, things happen that create delays that are beyond our control. The next step is the re-lining of the remaining sewer system slated for repairs. This will be less invasive and shouldn't cause too much problems traffic wise.

Why did we wait until the Main Street was paved before ripping it up? The paving was out of our control as this was a Manitoba Infrastructure project and the fact that it takes a long time for all the engineering plans, tendering and acquiring grants to be able to do a project of this magnitude. We have a very tight budget and have to pick and choose what we can do year after year. We were able to secure a 50% grant for this project saving our residents over \$500,000.

Remembrance Day is fast approaching and again due to COVID Council has decided to do the same as last year and post a video. This is a new video, so make sure you take the time to look at it and remember those who have lost their lives to give us the freedom that we have today.
